
Lisbon (L Geophysical)

General Characterization

- Lisbon is the capital of a country with 10.3 million inhabitants and the center of a metropolitan region with a population of 2.9 million.
- Being the country's capital has costs.
 Every day the city's population grows by 70 per cent due to commuter movements.
- After losing 257,000 residents over the past five decades (around 1/3rd of its population) Lisbon city stopped experiencing a decrease in population during the first decade of the 2000s (with a significant decrease in the rate of demographic loss compared to previous decades, losing only 3% of its population in the last 10 years). The number of families has also been increasing, and the number of young residents as well.
- The Lisbon Metropolitan Area is where the country's economic decision-making centers are located.

It accounts for around **36% of the country's GDP** and **employs around 1,478,000 people** (29% of the country's employment), with an apparent labor productivity 1.2 times higher than that of the country.

 Currently, there is a strong pressure for demographic decline nationwide, which could reverse the recorded trend and result in the city losing population again.







GVA and employment by economic activity in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area (AML)







Business and Entrepreneurship


- The Lisbon Metropolitan Area has many high-tech companies and research centers. It has approximately 370 thousand firms located there.
- The **number of workers employed** by foreign companies and in the **high-tech** sectors in Lisbon **exceeds the national average**.
- **Lisbon** remains an **attractive location** for many **multinational companies**, with the potential for expansion. Naturally, shared service centres and nearshore services tend to establish here.
- Software and internet, as well as health and well-being services, are the main sectors with great potential for development here.










Sectors' weight in GDP in AML*

Human capital and knowledge

- Lisbon provides a pool of highly skilled professionals who are adaptable, innovative, linguistically diverse, and competitive, with over 40% of Lisbon Metropolitan area inhabitants holding advanced academic degrees.
- Around a quarter of the country's workers and employed people are in the Lisbon region, where there are currently approximately 95,000 people without jobs.
- Lisbon Metropolitan area has an R&D expenditure ratio of 1.7 per cent of GDP, a significant figure in the European context. Around 433.217 students were enrolled in higher education in 2020/2021
- The Lisbon Region accounts for about 43 per cent of the country's total research and development expenditure, with the business sector responsible for 49 per cent of this.





Academic qualifications of the resident population




University education









Breakdown of total R&D expenditure by sector of execution



 Lisbon is a privileged platform for trade between continents, particularly with the seven Portuguese-speaking countries

- Ideal location for companies wishing to export or invest internationally.
- The Lisbon Metropolitan Area is the origin of 30 per cent of the country's exports and is the destination of 49% of the country's imports
- Exports have grown by over 90 per cent in the last 10 years
- 2.4 million guests a year visit Lisbon Metropolitan Area (AML)
- More than 55 per cent of these tourists come from foreign markets, with particular emphasis on Brazil, USA, France, Spain and Germany, the United Kingdom






